Shared Love Uganda has a wealth of competent and vibrant team of managers enriched with established policies, systems and structures at all levels formulated to enhance accountability and service delivery.

The structures and processes established include: The executive council who acts as the AGM, the board of Trustees, Management board, and the administrative management team.

The trustees are the ones that safe guard the properties of the organization and nothing much that can be done without their con-

sent. The executive council is a component of all key SLU stakeholders and acts as the AGM where critical decisions are made plus election of board members. Yet the management board of 6 people looks into the running of the organization and is the policy maker of the organization. The Director is the Chief Executive Officer assisted by other Functionaries that include: the administrative team management team which entails heads of department i.e. Child Development facilitator, Human Resource, and Community Development facilitator.

The above personnel form the basis for Research, Planning, Organization, Mobilization, Coordination, Implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation of performance in the Organization.

An Independent External Audit is annually administered to Shared Love Uganda to enhance efficiency, effectiveness and value for money audits.

# Report from the Child Department

Receive greetings from children, parents and the department at large, we thank the Lord for taking us through 2020 and enabling us to all we have done, we also thank our sponsors for the support rendered to us towards reaching and transforming the lives of Orphans and vulnerable children (OVC's).this department focuses much on a wholistic development of a child I.e. Physical. Social, Economic and spiritual development. Despite of the Covid- 19 pandemic which has been rampant this year, Shared Love Uganda has done various activities to see that children are catered for and protected. In 2020, we have focused much on Sponsorship, Child protection and safeguarding.

## Major activities in 2020

### SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

During these years, children have not been at school since schools were put on hold due to the outbreak of Corona Virus, we have visited all sponsored children providing them with food and other basic needs, we have also supported them with seeds as a way of empowering them in food security.



## a) Poverty eradication among children.

We have encouraged our children to have small projects which can help them to get money and sustain themselves and their families.

Meet Jackeline Nmaweje, a primary Five pupil at Shared Love Vocational Junior school, she loves playing soccer, netball and athletics. She decides to start burning charcoal, she plans sell it to the community people and raise money to repair their broken house and to get their basic needs.



She is Benadetta Namwanje and she is in Senior one but since she has not been going to school, she decided to join as saloon to learn hair dressing, she can now plait different styles, there are more children who need such skills but we don't have the course at our vocation center, we pray that God provides us with funds and we perches the necessary requirement then we shall be able to include it among the courses offered, if resources could allow, we could have empowered her with startup capital and she put up her own saloon as she is also continuing with her high school education.

## b) Christmas party

It's our culture as Christians to celebrate Christmas, these years we celebrated it in style and we thank out sponsors for the support, father Christmas gave out gifts to 56 sponsored children as Christmas gifts and also served cake and drinks, the gospel was also preached to them about the birth of Jesus Christ.

## Child Protection and Case Management



We have managed to sensitize communities using community radios in different villages about child protection and safeguarding, we have also been able to put up a child Protection committee of 45 members from nine villages who also work as child monitors.

### b) Case management

During these years, we have had different cases under the child department. We resettled Nabukenya Magret who disappeared from her parents after being physically abused, we resettled her to her uncles place and they were happy to receive her.



We also handled a case of a child who was cut by a step father, the file was opened up but the father is still on hunt by the police.



We have also handled other different cases in teenagers who have reached the adolescent stage on the local council level with the help of child monitors and local council authorities.





## Introduction.

Receive greetings from the education department in the mighty name of Jesus Christ, we sincerely thank to all our partners for your moral, physical, and financial commitments towards the prosperity of shared love vocational junior school and shared love vocation Centre Makukuba, may GOD reward you abundantly.

In the matters stated in the reference above, we are pleased to report to you the following as far as the education department is concerned.

## 1) Academics during Lockdown

This year has been a challenge more so to the education section in the entire country since schools were asked to close as a way of controlling the speed of Covid-19.

To see that children are catered for academically, Shared Love Vocational Junior School carried out various activities which include; teachers visiting pupils to carry out coaching, encouraging parents to buy Magazines and newspapers with pass PLE and teachers also used this time to make teaching aids (Learning materials)



## 2) Infrastructural development and Expansion

The Lord has been with us this year despite of the tuff situations, we have managed to construct new class room blokes and also renovated the two old blocks. We have been able to put a temporary fence around the school premises as way of strengthening the security but we pray God to provide and we construct a permanent wall fence. We have also managed to buy more land where we have put the playground and the remaining part its where we hope to construct staff quarters, by God's grace we have installed solar energy at the school and we thank our sponsors for the support, may God continue using you.

### 3) Capacity building for teachers.

The lockdown has given us a chance to empower our teachers as a way of equipping them for service by the time children come back, we have had two workshops one was about micro soft office and the second was about Phoenix (Sounds) which was mainly for Kindergarten teachers.



### 4) School project

We have managed to set up a banana plantation though it has been interfered by harsh weather conditions like hailstone and high sunshine but it is still existing. This was aimed at improving on the diet of over 400 people both teachers and learners at school, it was also aimed at saving the school from buying banana from outside and equipping children with agricultural skills.



## 5). Opening of the candidate classes

This year, we were to have our second primary seven class sit for Primary Leaving Exams (PLE) but school was put on hold but we thank God that the Government letter allowed only candidate class to resume and our students reported and completed the term successfully, we thank God that no child was infected by the Covid-19.

### **Other areas which need prayers.**


We need to construct dormitories which will help the children who walk long distances coming to school from various challenges they meet on the way which sometimes lead to poor performance.

Pray with us for God to provide us with the resources to build an independent Kindergarten section (ECD).

We thank God for the new buildings we have God this year but according to our growing population at school we pray that God provide us with more classes.

We have children who have finished the primary level and they have to join high school but we don't have it, they have to move over 5 miles therefore, we call for your support and prayers in that we can put up a secondary school.

## Report from the Vocation Centre



The vocation Centre had also moved well and before covid 19 we had 10 single mothers taking up courses in tailoring and book making, however book making as a course is not charged not only those ones but also our junior school pupils were also involved in the skilling programme, however much as corona virus interrupted with our skilling program, the vocation Centre continued operating even though it had no students to be taught but the vocation instructors were in busy in place making masks, books and bags in preparation for the second term studying, some the things made during this covid season are here as seen in the pictures below



The picture above is the vocation skills centre, this year we have managed to complete its ceiling but we believe the remaining part of plastering and painting God will pave way.

### I. conclusion

We thank all our partners for the tremendous work that the Lord in enabling you to do with us, we dream to reduce the illiteracy rate from 86 to at least 35% , having well structured classrooms, having at least 5 acres of land, establishment of a primary/secondary school, we are moving good by the Grace of God and we seeing light at the end of the tunnel as our motto says **"LIGHT THE WORLD"**.

## Report from the Health Centre



**Shared Love Health centre** was introduced after finding out that people get sick due to various reasons which include taking dirty water from open sources, ignorance and mosquitoes from swamps yet the nearest health centre is over 6 miles away, this called our attention to have a health centre facility in Makukuba.

### **Major activities done in 2020.**

- Opening of the health centre
- Our community participation



1) Opening of the health centre

Shared Love Health Centre by God's Grace was officially opened this year by the District Health Officer of Mukono District. We thank the Lord for stretching his Healing Hand upon Shared Love Health Centre where cases over 1,000 patients have been handled with 40% being Malaria cases.



We offer various services which include: General medication (outpatient and inpatient), Laboratory, Maternity, Family planning, Antenatal, immunization, Dental services, minor Surgeries, HIV testing and counselling



## 2) Our community participation.

Community Based Health Care is also offered to the community of which its main aim is to promote sanitation and personal hygiene through health educating the people. This is done through working hand in hand with the village Health teams, pray with us for God to provide us with the necessities to facilitate more trainings and even empower the 15 VHT members to go in communities and mobilize people to go for treatment and check-ups.

### Areas to pray for;

We normally receive between 10 to 15 patents a day, these big number gives us a reason for expansion, we need to build more wards for both male and female patients. We also need to build staff quarters.

We need to have un ultra sound Scan and ART Clinic at the Health Centre since they are essentially needed by the Community.

### Challenges

Some of the major challenges we do encounter include: Poor financial status of the community members, were by 60% of the population cannot afford to pay for the



small token charged at the Health Centre as a user fee.

Lack of family planning gadgets to cater for all mothers who needs family planning services and also limited funds to run all services successfully

Lack of Staff Quarters at the Health Centre which limits their availability.

Despite of the activities which we have failed to do because of preventive measures against Covid-19 e.g. medical camps and community gatherings for sensitizations, we still want to thank our partners for the tireless work done to ensure that the Health Centre was officially opened and it's now saving people's lives. I pray that may the good Lord continue to Bless you in abundance.

## Report from the Community Department



### Introduction:

Receive Christian greetings from the field staff and community members, we appreciate God for enabling us all being a part of the development we now see increasing in Makukuba community.

Shared love Uganda a Christian NGO based in Makukuba Ward, Nakifuma-Nagalama Town Council, Mukono district in central Uganda.

This year Shared Love Uganda has worked with several groups of parents called Self Help Groups (SHGs), community leaders, groups of community members through water and sanitation committees, legal bodies and various stakeholders in development. Even when the country was hit by the corona virus, we thank God for these activities below.

### 2020 Activities:

1. SHGs activities and projects
2. Water, hygiene and sanitation
3. Community empowerment

### Details Of The Report:

#### 1. SHG's ACTIVITIES AND PROJECTS

Self Help Groups (SHGs) are organized groups of members both male and female who come up and join each other for the common goal of development. We started the year with 13 groups and as managed to end the year with 10 groups of 15 members on average (109 women and 12 men). These are residents in 6 villages of Makukuba ward and meet once every week on specific days as per the group constitution.

#### ACTIVITIES:

Brick laying – 1 group from Kawoomya  
Banana plantations – 5 groups  
Savings and credit management- 5 groups with only Vsla  
Cocoa plantations- 1 group in Kizima  
These groups have received support and have been empowered with different skills in farming and credit management from SLU.

We thank the Almighty for enabling SLU reach out to families, communities and leaders through these Projects and activities done through SHGs in different villages of Makukuba ward.



Groups into banana farming are improving greatly as some have started harvesting their Matooke for sale to boost the group incomes and hence increase their family and individual savings.

As these improve on their group projects especially the banana plantations, their individual gardens are improving as the different techniques learnt in groups are also used for individual progress.



Some of the gardens that we started this and those we started towards the end of last year with matooke ready for market during the festive season.

## 2. WATER, HYGIENE AND SANITATION



Water and sanitation are essential for life and health, but they are also essential for dignity, empowerment and prosperity. Water and sanitation are human rights, fundamental to every child and adult. But in Uganda, poor sanitation and hygiene, as well as unequal access to safe drinking water, make thousands of children very sick and at risk of death. Diarrhea alone, one of the three major childhood killers in Uganda, kills 33 children every day.

SLU with support from partners has managed to drill 3 boreholes in the villages of Makukuba, Gonve and Kaabulo the places where people shared water with animals and walking longer distances. These serve over 500 people per village and help to protect young children and women who used to risk their lives looking for water from far and unpleasant places with snakes, people raping them on the way and other associated problems.



The drilling was done in the presence of local leaders, parents and children as a way of sensitizing them on the ways how to keep the bore holes clean and safe for use to all people.



children are the major water collectors followed by women but still much time is needed at the clean and safe water source for them because of the bigger numbers of people that need water from the few boreholes to sustain such numbers.



Repairment of 4 other boreholes were done with the help of the engineers and water user committees from every village.

### **Home sanitation:**

One of our main focus in health is to have at least 250 families each with a well-built latrine, a drying rack, a hand washing facility and a garbage collection pit. This is done by helping communities build resilience through empowerment to the VHTs, parents and caretakers, teachers and community leaders with necessary information in sensitization meetings on home sanitation and hygiene and helping them raise up such items for an ideal home and this was done in the month of October with the help of political leaders, religious leaders, Village Health Teams (VHTs), parents and caretakers and the staff members.

Different materials and items were given out like; Liquid soap, Jerricans for making tippy taps, Toilet covers, Charts with messages of how to make tippy taps in Luganda and English and Nails, hummers, strings to more than 200 households.

**Some of the items given out to the household heads in Makukuba community.**



Through the year we have managed to do the following in different households under hygiene and home sanitation.

- 70 Tippy taps have been put in place
- 59 plate stands were set
- Parents and caretakers started cleaning and clearing bushy areas around their homes
- 47 solid waste pits were established
- 148 pit latrines have been maintained and at least very few are not in good shape

### **3. COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT**

#### **a. Self help groups**

Shared Love Uganda has continuously supported communities with skills, financial boost in groups and to individuals registered as members in SHGs. These are registered at the local council offices and proceedings are being made for district registrations. These have been involved in different trainings like; Savings and credit management, starting up small manageable businesses, modern farming methods, child protection and safeguarding, Adverse childhood experiences and many others.

Over 10 groups have been supported with financial, material help through provision of organic manure, banana clusters, coffee seedlings and different other items which has helped them start up banana, coffee plantations and bricks as group projects in different communities.

Picture below shows some of the groups in a training on gender-based violence in families.



**Other trainings and gatherings with the SHG members include;**

- 80 families reached with the Distribution seeds for planting
- More than 200 families reached with food support during the corvid outbreak
- More than 300 families reached with messages of hand wash, wearing masks and social distancing.



- 23 families supported with piglets for family wellbeing
- 18 adult goats given out to the Muslim families



## B. Goats project.

We started the goat project this year with an aim of lifting to standards of the community people in the Self Help Groups (SHG,s) economically, we put up a module farm at Shared Love Vocational school which is serving as the breeding center when a goat gives birth we extend it to a group member and also where people come for trainings on goat management. We started with 8 goats but now we have 12 four being young ones (Kids).



## C. Empowerment program

We started the empowerment program through involving all groups in different trainings in mind set change, how to start up small businesses, financial literacy and ways of raising individual and group funds. 10 groups received trainings from 4 centers and after carrying out several checks on individual members in different groups. We started giving empowerment fund and we have so far given to 13 and they have been able to boost their businesses.

## Report from the Spiritual Department

Spiritual development is a process, people in our operation area need to hear and get to know about God in that they can believe on him and after believing on him they need to be disciplined and walk with him for the rest of their lives. During this year, spiritual development programs have faced a big challenge where churches were closed and gatherings were also put on hold as a way of controlling the spread of Covid- 19, as Shared Love Uganda we are committed to the disadvantaged and this made us to devise means of reaching the gospel to the people but following the prevention measures which were put by the government and we have been able to carry out various activities shown below.

- 1) Door to door evangelism
- 2) Strengthened connection with church leaders
- 3) Opening of churches
- 4) Sunday school teachers training
- 5) Christmas carols

### ACTIVITY BREAKDOWN

#### Door to Door evangelism conducted.

During this year when the churches were put on hold, we decided to visit people in their homes and preach the gospel to them, 600 people including children were reached with the help of Lay Readers led by the SLU staff.

## Strengthened connection with church leaders.

This year, we conducted a church leader's workshop where we talked about the roles they are expected to play for a wholistic development of a child and by the end of the year, they have improved on children ministry, some even organised for them Christmas parties out of Church.

## Opening of churches

Churches were closed as a way of contraling the spread of Covid-19 but we thank God that in the third quator of this year, churches were openes and people started to go to church for prayers but following the preventive measures put by the government though Sunday schools remaned on hold and strictly children are not allowed to go to church.



The government accepted churches to operate and our children are able to take readings in church during service.

## Sunday school teacher's training

During this we organised a Sunday school teacher,s training and 9 teacher attended and they were equiped with skills on how they can evengalise to children from homes and in communities, they have created Good news clubs in their villages and they have rached 210 children and 110 have given their lives to Christ



They could have practicums which were like exams as a way to practice what they will be doing in communities and launch was always provided with breakfast.

## Christmas celebrations

Luke 2:11. "For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord" KJV. Like never before, this year's Christmass was celebrated difrently in a way that father Christmass moved around communitites visiting children in their homes while giving them gifts and gatherd them in homes to share the gospel with them about the birth of Jesus Christ, 340 children were reached with in four centers and 26 children got saved with 1 adult.



We also had Christmas carols where choirs sung songs for christmass both from within the community and guest Chairs, 170 people attended and we give back the glory to God.
